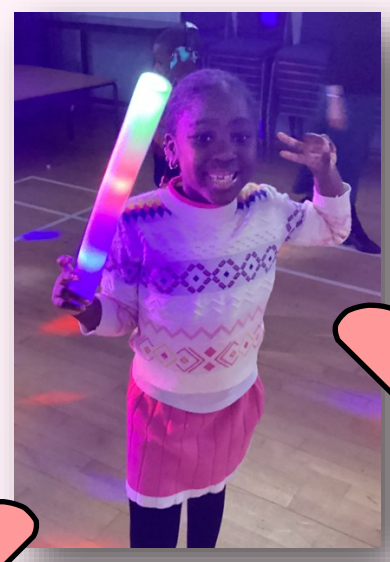


# Valentine's Disco

When we return after the half term break we will be holding 'Children's Mental Health Week' at St. Joseph's!

We have lots of wonderful activities planned for the week...

On **MONDAY**, all of the children will be working in their classes to produce their own contributions towards a whole school display. This display will focus on the fact that we all have our own special, safe spaces but that we all belong in the town of Ross-on-Wye.

On **TUESDAY**, we will have a wonderful carousel of wellbeing activities! The children will move around the classroom throughout the day, spending time with each teacher and focusing on a different element of positive mental health and wellbeing. In the Reception classroom, children can enjoy a pamper spa; in the Year 1 classroom, children will get to play with calming sensory playdough; in the Year 2 classroom, children will take part in a special music-based activity; in the Year 3 classroom, children will join in with a fabulous dance session; in the Year 4 classroom, children will relax with some yoga; in the Year 5 classroom, children will enjoy a quiet, rhythmic craft activity and in the Year 6 classroom, the children will get to try out some mindfulness art.

MARCH!**

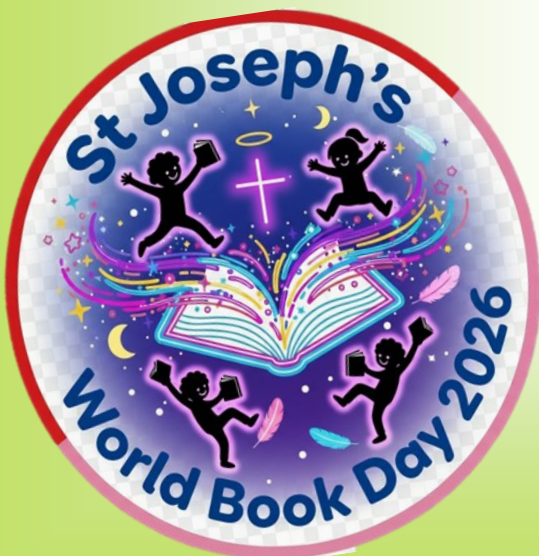
We are so excited to be celebrating this annual event here in school. On this day everyone is invited to come to school dressed as their favourite book character. We have so many exciting activities planned for this special day!

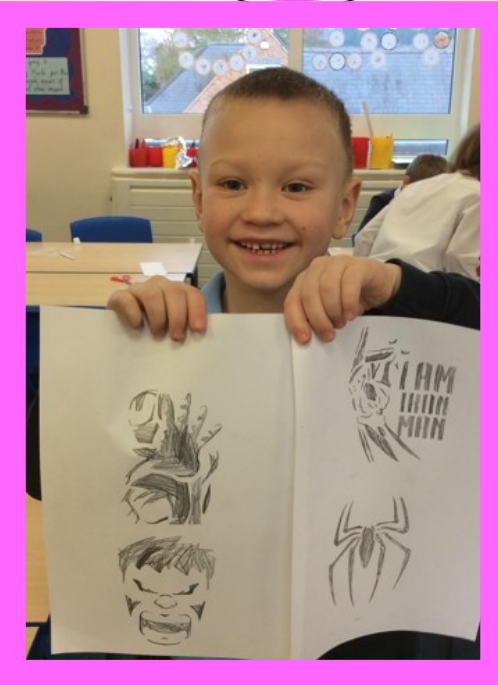

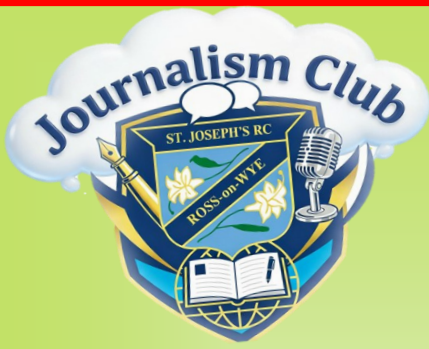

**Congratulations to our children who were chosen for the Table of Awesomeness this week by our lunchtime teachers. We are super proud of you all! A big thank you to Mrs. Bennett and Mrs. French for organising this special event!**

As part of our Healthy Schools initiative, we're working hard to create a school environment where children can thrive—healthy bodies, healthy minds, and happy learners. A key part of this is supporting good hydration throughout the day, because choosing water instead of sugary drinks helps to reduce sugar intake and supports children's health and wellbeing.



### Healthy hydration at school

To support this, we are a water-only school during the school day. This means children should bring a named bottle filled with plain water only—please do not send squash, juice, flavoured water or fizzy drinks. Parents may choose to add pieces of fresh fruit (for example slices of lemon, orange or berries) to their child's water bottle to add a little natural flavour.

### Why we're doing this

Many drinks marketed for children can still contain added sugar, sweeteners, acids and flavourings, which can contribute to tooth decay and other preventable health problems over time. Choosing water helps children build healthy habits and keeps the school day focused on learning.

### How does this work in practice?

Children have regular opportunities to drink water during the day, and we'll continue to encourage them to keep their water bottles topped up. Thank you for your support. We really appreciate your help in making this a consistent message for all children. If your child has a medical need that affects what they can drink, please contact the school office so we can support you.
