Psalm

a sacred song or poem used in worship

Sacraments

very important gifts from Jesus when we receive his special help

Baptism

a sacrament when we enter into the life of Jesus and become a Christian

Bible

the Word of God, the scriptures of the Old and New Testaments

Old Testament

the first part of the Bible that tells us about events up to the time Jesus was born

New Testament

the second part of the Bible that tells us about the life, death and resurrection of Jesus, his apostles and the first Christians

Key Vocabulary

Advent	time of preparation for Jesus' coming
Advent wreath	a green wreath with four candles, a symbol of the coming of Jesus
Annunciation	when the angel Gabriel brought God's message to Mary that He wanted her to be the mother of His Son, Jesus
Isaiah	a prophet
John the Baptist	a prophet who called the people back to God asking them to repent of their sins
Magnificat	the song of praise that Mary sang at Elizabeth's house (Luke 1:46-55)
Prophet	a person who speaks for God
Zechariah	a priest in the Temple in Jerusalem; the husband of Elizabeth and father of John the Baptist
