Key Vocabulary

Covenant

a very solemn promise between two people or between God and people

Moses

the prophet who received the Ten Commandments from God and led the Israelites out of slavery in Egypt

Exodus

the Israelites escape from slavery in Egypt

Sinai

the mountain on which God gave the Ten Commandments to Moses

Commandments

the laws that God gave to the Israelites to help them to remain faithful to the covenant

Virtues

behaviour showing high moral standards

Grace

God's free and loving gift to us

Key Vocabulary

Samuel	a priest, judge and a prophet in the Old Testament
David	Jesse's son, chosen by God to be king of Israel
Anointing	a sacred act of blessing with oil
Psalm	a liturgical poem or song
Antiphon	a verse said or sung before and after a psalm
Advent	four weeks of preparation for celebrating the birth of Jesus and his second coming
Covenant	a solemn promise between two people or groups of people, e.g. God's covenant with Abraham
